
HISTORY OF BALVIHAR (DECADES IN THE MAKING)

- > Started in the late 70's in a Founders Basement
- > Moved to Berlin Temple when it was purchased in early 80's
- Moved to the Marlton Schools in 2010
- > Last year we had:
 - 296 Students
 - 28 High School Student Leaders
 - 46 Teachers
 - 10 Operations and Admin Volunteers
- ➤ We are 100% Volunteer Run Many of us are 2nd Generation!

- > 16-18 sessions per year on Sunday mornings
- > Year End Annual Day Show
- Optional Shloka Classes offered pre-session
- Domino's pizza for lunch

TEACHING MODEL & CLASS STRUCTURE

- Classes organized by school grade
- > Two Adult Teachers per class for Pre-K to 6th Grade for Core Classes
- Three Teacher Team for 7th & 8th with each teacher focused on area of expertise
- Separate Conversational Hindi and Yoga Teaching Teams
- One or two High School Student Volunteer(s) that are Balvihar graduates
- Class size: 15-20 students (2022 Average 14)
- ➤ 150+ YouTube "Topic of the Day (TOD)" videos to support in class learning. TOD Videos are short ~5 minute videos created by our high school Student Leaders. 

Drop Off

- Except Pre-K parents, other parents will not be allowed in the building at anytime.
- ➤ Parents must drop their children off at the main door between 9:40 9:50 AM. Early drops offs not permitted.
- ➤ Children arriving late will be asked to wait in cafeteria until the completion of morning shlokas. Children arriving after 10:30 AM will be marked absent and be ineligible for perfect attendance award.
- > Please note Optional Shloka Classes begin with Session 2 (September 18th)

IMPORTANT LOGISTICS: PICK UP

Pick Up

- Children will be eating lunch at Balvihar this year. Parents will NOT be allowed during lunch.
- > Pre-K to 2nd Grade Children will be escorted out at their dismissal time.
- > 3rd 8th will be allowed to exit post lunch.
- > A Marlton Police Officer and Volunteers will be outside during dismissal times
- Please be on time. You must arrive at your youngest child's dismissal time. Do not tell your child to wait inside for an older sibling!
- Please park your car and walk to the front of the building to pick up your child. Do not park in driveway. You will get a ticket.
- If you need to pick up your child early, please do so before 11:45 AM. No early dismissals after 11:45 AM.

ADDITIONAL POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Required Dress Code

Students are expected to wear their Balvihar T-Shirts during each session of Balvihar. It helps us both track students and builds cohesion among students. Students who repeatedly violate this rule will not be admitted into class.

Security

Under normal circumstances, only the Marlton Middle School entrance located in front of the main parking lot should be used for entrance and exit. In case of an emergency, all of the school's exits can be used for egress. The program has hired Evesham Township Police to serve as on-site security at every Balvihar session from 9:30 am to 1:30 pm. When Annual Day practice sessions begin, hours of Police presence will be expanded or adjusted accordingly. All Parents and Children should feel empowered to approach the Officer present with any safety concerns or issues.

Keeping Balvihar Safe

We want Balvihar to be a safe and healthy environment for our children to learn and grow. ADDITIONAL POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Prohibited Substances & Items

Alcohol, drugs, or other substances that can be used to cause a condition of intoxication, inebriation, excitement, or stupefaction are prohibited at any Balvihar event. New Jersey law expressly prohibits weapons at schools. As such, there are serious penalties for possessing a weapon of any kind, including firearms, knives, stun guns, tear gas, BB guns, and imitation firearms, on school grounds. Parents and students should be vigilant. If anyone becomes aware of or suspects the presence of any of these banned items on premises or that a student or Volunteer is under the influence of any substance, please notify the Balvihar Administrative team and/or the police officer on duty immediately. Any Student caught with possession of any prohibited substance or item will be expelled from Balvihar.

Code of Conduct, Cell Phones & Toys

Balvihar is an educational program. We need to maintain a positive, supportive environment. Each family has agreed to a code of conduct as part of the enrollment process. Except in the case of emergency, students are prohibited from using cell phones at all times while Balvihar is in session. Repeated violation of this rule may result in your child not being admitted into Balvihar. Children are not allowed to play with toys during class. Please familiarize your child with the rules and the need to report anything that would result in the positive environment being compromised.

ADDITIONAL POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Food, Beverages or Water bottles

No food and beverages of any kind including water are allowed in any part of the school except the cafeteria. The school does have water fountains which students are permitted to use. Violation of these rules can result in loss of the school for Balvihar. We ask that you please ensure your child has eaten a good breakfast prior to arriving.

Sickness Guidelines for Parents

Parents are asked not to bring their child to Balvihar if their child is unwell. This includes but is not limited to cold/flu-like symptoms, fever, vomiting, diarrhea, severe cough, colored nasal drainage, pink eye, lice, open skin lesions or any infectious disease. If a child shows any signs of sickness during Balvihar, we will contact you to pick your child up.

GRADUATION & STUDENT LEADER PROGRAM

8TH GRADE GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

In order to graduate from the Balvihar Program a student must have greater than 75% attendance and receive a passing grade on the final exam during their final year (8th grade).

STUDENT LEADER PROGRAM (for 8th grade students only)

Dedicated graduates from Balvihar program have the opportunity to come back and volunteer as Student Leaders. Student Leaders program offers the opportunity to build leadership, teamwork, public speaking, and teaching skills. Students are selected based on their commitment to the Balvihar program as demonstrated by their attendance, engagement and enthusiasm in the classroom and program application. Students must have 85% attendance in 8th grade in order to apply.

REQUEST FOR CONSIDERATION

RECOGNIZE

- > This program is run by volunteers.
- > We all have families and busy professional careers.
- > WE do this as a service to make the world and our community better.

PLEASE BE:

- > RESPECTFUL: Volunteers spending 100's of hours don't deserve to be mistreated.
- > TIMELY: Late students disrupt the learning experience.
- > **ATTENTIVE:** Read our emails!
- ENGAGED: Talk to your children about their lesson and make sure they are staying on track
- **PATIENT:** We make mistakes, and we can't always fix them immediately.
- FOLLOW RULES: With over 750 parents and students, even a small number of people asking for special treatment creates a great deal of work and burden.
